As you say this, raise your hands up to your shoulders with palms out. Then bend forward so your back is parallel with the ground. Grasp your knees with your hands and look at the floor where you plan to place your face in prostration.

As you say this, stand straight up. Raise your hands to your shoulders or ears with palms out. Then place your hands on your chest, right over left. Look at the floor where you plan to place your face in prostration.

As you say this, prostrate by placing your hands on the floor first and then your knees. Your forehead, nose, palms, knees, and toes should be touching the floor. Bring your ankles together and keep your elbows up and bent 90° (unless it would disturb others praying nearby).

Kneel so that both knees are on the floor. Lay your left foot on the floor and sit on top of it. Your right foot's toes should be pointing forward with the heel propped up. Place your hands on your thighs or your knees. Look at the place your face was in prostration.

As you say this, prostrate again as you did in step 5.

If you are returning to step 2, first sit as you did in step 6. Then say **All law who uk bur** (Allah is greater [than everything else]) and push off the floor with your hands to stand as you did in step 2, but don't raise your hands to your shoulders/ears with palms out. Just place your hands on your chest, right over left. Look at the place your face was in prostration.

Sit as you were in step 6. Clench the fingers of your right hand into a fist and point forward with the index finger. Look at this finger and move it up and down as you recite.

Units per Prayer:

One unit of prayer starts with standing in Step 2 and ends with Step 8 or 9, depending on where you are in the prayer.

- Fajr: 2 units
- Dhuhr: 4 units
- Asr: 4 units
- Maghrib: 3 units
- Ishaa: 4 units

Instructions:

- As you pray, hold this learning aid in your hand and whisper the **bold text**. Translations are provided for your information but shouldn't be recited.
- This learning aid teaches you one way to pray. As you continue to learn Islam, you will learn variations and enhancements that you can include in the way you pray.
- This learning aid is intended to supplement, not replace, a thorough study of Islamic prayer.

Wudu Quick Reference Guide

How to wash before prayers:

- 1. Hands: Wash your hands. (3 times)
- 2. **Mouth:** Swish a handful of water in your mouth and spit it out. *(3 times)*
- 3. Nose: Cup some water in your right hand and bring it up to your nose. Snuff the water and then blow it out, using your left hand to pinch your nose to remove the water. (3 *times*)
- 4. Face: Splash and wipe water on your entire face from hairline to chin and ear to ear. (3 times)
- 5. **Beard:** If you have a beard, cup some water in your hand and rub it in your beard, combing your wet fingers through it.
- 6. **Right arm:** Wash your right arm from tips of your fingers up to and including your elbow. Be sure to wash under rings and between fingers. *(3 times)*
- 7. Left arm: Wash your left arm just like you did your right arm. (3 times)
- 8. **Head & Ears:** Wet your hands and wipe over your head from hairline to nape of neck and then back to where you started. Then put your index fingers in your ears and wipe your thumbs behind your ears. Do this once. If you're wearing hijab, you can just wipe over it instead.
- 9. **Right foot:** Wash your right foot up to and including your ankle. Be sure to wipe between your toes. *(3 times)*
- 10. Left foot: Wash your left foot just as you did your right foot. (3 times)
- 11. **Socks:** If you made wudu previously and put on socks before losing wudu, you don't have to wash your feet. Instead, simply wet your hands and then wipe once over the top of your socks starting with the toes. You can keep doing this for 24 hours from the moment you first wiped over your socks. After 24 hours you'll need to wash your feet when making wudu, but you can then wear socks again.



At this point there are optional post-prayer sayings we are encouraged to recite to further praise Allah and seek forgiveness. As you continue to learn Islam, you will learn what to say, God willing.

If you are returning to step 2, say All law who uk bur (Allah is greater [than everything else]) and push off the floor with your hands to stand up straight. Then raise your hands to your shoulders/ears with palms out. Then place your hands on your chest, right over left. Look at the floor where your face was when you prostrated.

Daily Prayer Timings:

Prayer can be done at any time between its start and end time as described below.

- 1. Fair (2 units): From true dawn until just before sunrise
- 2. Dhuhr (4 units): When the sun passes its zenith until Asr time starts. If you attend Friday (Jumuah) prayer at a mosque, you do not need to pray Dhuhr on Friday. Attending Friday prayers at the mosque is required for men.
- 3. Asr (4 units): When the shadow of an object is equal to its height (plus the length of its shadow was when the sun was at its zenith) until Maghrib time starts.
- Maghrib (3 units): Just after sunset until there is no 4. redness in the horizon.
- 5. Ishaa (4 units): When Maghrib's time ends until Fajr time starts.

Note: there are additional prayers and more details regarding these timings that you'll learn about as you continue to study Islam, God willing.

Losing Wudu—Common Causes:

If you make wudu, you don't have to redo it before every prayer. You only need to redo it before a prayer if you've lost/broken your wudu. Here are some common causes:

- Urinating
- Defecating
- Passing wind
- Deep sleep/Unconsciousness
- Touching your private parts without a barrier/clothing
- Sexual intercourse (Requires a full bath before prayer. A full bath means washing your entire body and washing out your mouth and nose.)
- Ejaculation/wet dream (Requires a full bath before prayer.)
- Menstruation (Don't pray until cycle ends and then you must take a full bath before prayer. You don't need to make up prayers you missed during your cycle.)
